In addition, Roosevelt reported UC Chair O'Connor will more proactively recruit faculty to place their names on the ballot. Roosevelt will also announce in the ASC Report to the Faculty Senate.

  - C. Instructional Academic Staff Workload Policy & CGS Roosevelt asked members to review the policy prior to the next meeting. She noted it would be expensive to change from five to four courses at CGS. Discussion ensued regarding differences in policies here and at CGS.
