GFC/GCC Change

The table below contains the GFC's recommendations for the revised approval matrix under the new graduate governance structure.

The GCC and GFC recommend an approval structure for the dropping of a degree, such as the discontinuation of a PhD program. The new charters make it clear that GCC approves the creation of new degrees and the modification of existing degrees, but it does not expressly refer to the discontinuation of degrees.

"Post-baccalaureate Level" Change

Currently, all post-baccalaureate programs must be approved by the GFC even though they don't include any graduate course work. The rationale behind this was that students would eventually want to apply these credits toward their master's programs and thus, GFC oversight was warranted. However, students are now required to be registered as graduate students in order to earn graduate credits; hence, post-bacc credits could not be applied to a future master's program. As such, oversight of post-baccalaureate programs would more appropriately fall under the purview of the APCC.
