V. Unfinished Business:

A. [New Curricular Area Code for UW Extension: UWX](#)

The working group met with Margaret Hankenson and Greg Ahrenhoerster. They had a good discussion and received answers to many questions. This program sees the sunseting of the previous UW Colleges online associate degree.

Committee members raised concerns whether the new program was going through appropriate governance channels.

CGS faculty are all in favor of the Collaborative Online Associate Degree. Essentially, it's an extension of the UW Colleges Online program and is another way for students to earn an associate degree. If we don't participate, students could still take courses through UWX, but we would lose the staffing component.

William Malcuit moved to approve the UWX curricular area code. Sara Jozwik seconded.
Four members voted to approve the motion; 10 voted against it; David DiValerio abstained.

Jay Kapellusch moved that the committee be open to reconsidering the Curricular Code when the ATI is presented. William Malcuit seconded and the motion carried.
