IV. Approval of the Minutes from the [December 10, 2019](#) APCC Meeting

Mark McBride moved to approve the December 2019 Minutes. Abera Gelan seconded and the motion carried.

V. Unfinished Business: None

VI. New Business:

1. [Computer Science, BA](#)

Authorization to Implement – effective Fall 2020. The BA is a smaller version of the existing BS and is intended as a double major or with two minors.

Stuart Moulthrop moved to approve the BA. Mark McBride seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

2. [Digital Arts and Culture, BA](#)

The interdisciplinary program has been around since 2001 as certificate and 2016 as CIM sub-major.

Andrew Kincaid moved to approve the BA. William Malcuit seconded and the motion carried.

3. [School Librarianship, Certificate](#)

State legislation changed the certification requirements due to the need for school librarians. A master's degree and teacher certification with two years' experience is no longer required. The certificate provides four pathways to state certification as a school librarian. Four pathways.

Christy Greenleaf moved to approve the Certificate. William Malcuit seconded and the motion carried.

4. [Collaborative Online Associate Degree](#)

The Collaborative Degree arose from the restructuring process – the UW Colleges online program was very successful, and UW System wanted this to continue under the UW Extended Campus. The collaborative program is intended to replicate the previous colleges program audience as the colleges program. The

program will primarily target the branch campus/CGS students, but also associate-level students across the country, and high school students for the Early College Credit Program (ECCP).

Committee members expressed concern that the proposal hasn't gone through the requisite governance channels. It was noted that changing modality does not require governance approval. CGS questioned whether it was being held to a different standard.

This program (as UW Colleges Online) has been in existence for 20 years and will continue to exist (Collaborative Online Associate Degree) with or without UWM. Does the University want to participate and receive the benefits? It is a robust program with an upward trending enrollment currently at 3100 students.

Madison isn't participating but it's a different beast. Madison doesn't offer the associate degree. In addition to our R1 status, we also have an access mission. By not participating, we remove an option for students who are already tenuous. We want to continue to provide access to students.

Pursuing as a defined degree through HLC. Not a mix and match situation.

William Malcuit moved to approve the UWX curricular code. Mark McBride seconded. Kristen Murphy noted that the curricular code was not on the agenda. William Malcuit amended his motion to remove the curricular code and to approve the Online Collaborative Associate of Arts and Science Degree. Mark McBride seconded. The motion carried with nine votes to approve, three votes against approving, and three abstentions.

VII. Adjournment. The meeting adjourned at 9:09 a.m.
