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Resolution in Support of the Black Lives Matter Movement

- 1 WHEREAS, the summer of 2020 has seen unprecedented social unrest in Southeastern Wisconsin and
- 2 throughout the country.
- 3 WHEREAS, the unconscionable modern-day lynching of unarmed Black people by police perpetuates a
- 4 long history of violence and oppression against Black people by state-sanctioned institutions.
- 5 **WHEREAS**, the University of Wisconsin Milwaukee (UWM) has asserted its commitment to diversity
- 6 and inclusion; as an institution, the constituency of our student body includes the largest proportion of
- 7 Students of Color in the UW-System.
- 8 WHEREAS, the murder of George Floyd by Minneapolis police spurred another wave of peaceful
- 9 protests against police violence and demands for de-funding of police institutions throughout the
- 10 country; looting and rioting associated with these protests have frequently been found to be spurred by
- 11 externalities such as white instigators and accelerationists (Source: Brookings Institution:
- 12 https://brook.gs/32UFDef).
- 13 WHEREAS, these protests were often met with unnecessary and oppressive violence, excessive use of
- 14 force, and displays of militarism by police institutions throughout the country, including the Milwaukee
- 15 Police Department (MPD).
- 16 WHEREAS, the UWM Police Department (UWMPD), under the auspices of Chancellor Mone, are
- 17 involved in a 'mutual aid agreement' that would have forced UWM to cooperate with MPD during the
- 18 height of these protests, including offering on-campus holding cells to detain protestors.
- 19 WHEREAS, police departments across the country, including MPD and UWMPD have seen increased
- 20 funding for military-style vehicles, weapons, training, and gear; the trend of militarization of police
- 21 forces has been identified as a significant factor in the suppression of People of Color, as described in
- the ACLU Report, War Comes Home (https://bit.ly/3gXR61F).
- 23 WHEREAS, campus safety and security operations do not require the use of military vehicles or
- 24 weaponry; the role of police officers in campus activities should at all times emphasize the wellbeing of
- 25 students and staff, and in the de-escalation of conflicts.
- WHEREAS, a coalition of community groups including Black Leaders Organizing Communities, the Black
- 27 Socialist Caucus of Milwaukee Democratic Socialists of America, the African American Civic Engagement
- 28 Roundtable, the Black Educators Caucus, the Milwaukee Democratic Socialists of America, the
- 29 Milwaukee Area Service and Hospitality Workers Organization, and Milwaukee County (District 4)
- 30 Supervisor Ryan Clancy have publicly requested a 25% cut to the Milwaukee County Sherriff's
- 31 department. (https://bit.ly/32UOtZo)

51 52 53 54 55 56 57	THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED ; We specifically demand that the UWM administration formally commit to de-militarization of the UWM Police Department, and that any and all cooperative ties to county, state and federal law enforcement (including ICE) be permanently severed; that the terms of the mentioned 'mutual aid agreement' be renegotiated to the satisfaction of the University Police Advisory Board as laid out above; that a detailed and thorough accounting of UWMPD's annual budget be publicly posted on the UWMPD website; and that the UWMPD budget be re-appropriated to reduce the number of police officers, weapons, and vehicles, in lieu of unarmed 'community officers' trained in social services, de-escalation, and conflict resolution.				
59 60 61	THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED ; We abhor the recent behavior and response of Kenosha police, both in the shooting of Jacob Blake, and the cooperation with white nationalists and militia members, some of whom were involved in the murder and serious injury of protestors.				
62 63 64 65 66	THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED ; We further strenuously request the City and County of Milwaukee follow demands (including those of the coalition listed at Line 26 above) to redistribute funding streams away from police and sheriff's departments (including our own UWMPD) toward social-betterment and community wellness activities, especially in areas of greater minority concentration, and to cease cooperation with state and federal law enforcement.
