VII. New Business:

A. Data Science, BS

Data Science degrees are in high demand. The proposed program requires no new faculty and very few new courses. There is a parallel effort on campus to create a data analytics degree. This will be a demanding program that is much more structured than Applied Math and Computer Science. This is a very marketable

degree. Electives will provide room to specialize. The program will be housed in L&S, which will also provide advising.

Aki Roberts moved to approve the new degree. Ben Church seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

B. <u>Program Review – Women's and Gender Studies</u>

The Review team recommended that the program be continued. Further recommendations include converting the visiting assistant professor line to a tenure-track line, providing stronger structural stability for instructional academic staff, adding additional full-time tenure-track faculty, gathering data from alumni, and implementing systematic assessment of program learning outcomes.

Bill Malcuit moved to approve the Women's and Gender Studies report. Aki Roberts seconded the motion and it carried.

VIII. Other

A. Program Review Process

HLC called UWM to task for falling behind in our 10-year reviews. We escaped sanctions because we had such good assessment of our OWC-B and QL-B courses. Programs have struggled to submit self-studies by the October deadline. Previously, the department profiles in the Office of Assessment and Institutional Research databases didn't drill down to individual programs. Jonathan Hanes has made changes so that information is now available at the program level. We need better templates for the self-study and report. The Provost's Office will work with APCC to revise the program review process.

Adam Andrews is our Assessment Coordinator and will work with APCC on promoting Gen Ed Review.
