A. GER Assessment

Adam Andrews discussed gaps in GER assessment. UWM needs to provide more thorough assessment data to HLC. Departments and faculty need guidance. There is a new GER assessment page on the assessment website. Use program review data infrastructure for GER data. GER Review process – APCC reports were the primary source of data for HLC but has fallen behind in reviewing GER. There should be an administrative infrastructure to assist APCC in successful GER review. We need a tight collaboration between Adam and committee. What do we need for HLC follow-up? Adam created a guide, based on APCC documents, to help departments. HLC is interested in the narrative – how are we using the data?

Two different purposes: 1) learning assessment for HLC; and 2) APCC review and approval of GER courses.

B. Discussion about Possible GER Reform with 2030 Co-Leads

Kathy Dolan and John Reisel discussed their work and plans for GER reform. They're looking at a core set of principles: student-centered experience, make path easier and more seamless, ways to focus on learning outcomes, smaller array of classes that qualify for GER, and new financial model.

Vision – GER devised around 5 or 6 learning outcomes with 8-10 courses. One GER program for all – campus-wide. Programs could make suggested recommendations, but they wouldn't be required or cause impediments to transfer.
