<u>CALL TO ORDER AND APPROVAL OF AGENDA</u> – The meeting was called to order by K. Dolan at 1:02 p.m. The agenda was approved as amended.

 - A. The Provost reported that Vice President Kamala Harris had been to the campus. The Provost will continue to meet with Schools and Colleges. The plan for realignment should be realized by November. The June Board of Regents meeting in Milwaukee will be an in person event.
 - B. Clark and Eilers discussed enrollments. There is considerable demand for online classes for the Fall. They proposed a hybrid model. There is concern that this is a work load issue for faculty. Classrooms will also have to be upgraded.

- A. There is no flexibility on the scheduling of mandatory trainings. UW System schedules these and they must be completed in 30 days. The UC suggested that HR highlights this to individuals on sabbatical.
- B. K. Dolan attended the ASC meeting and discussed voting rights for Academic Staff members of Schools and Colleges. The ASC suggested that this is part of a broader conversation that includes the new Teaching Professor and Research Professor titles and the participation of Academic Staff on graduate student committees.
- C. Vice-Chancellor R. Van Harpen would like names of individuals to serve on the Search and Screen committee for the new Chief of Police.
