- A. The committee went into closed session at 1:16 p.m. to discuss a request for a tenure clock extension. The committee rose from closed session at 1:17 p.m.
- B. The Board of Regents is meeting on Thursday and Friday of this week, preceded by a UW System Provosts meeting on Wednesday.
- C. The Health units are moving towards a new structure. The plan at this time is that the Public Health and preventative care areas will be in one unit, and the health care and treatment areas will be in a second unit. Other school/college restructuring is also making progress.
- D. The four-year graduation rate is up to 28%. The six-year graduation rate has increased to 46%. Coupled with increased retention rates, there are many positives with regards to student success. A deep dive to study methods for increasing the yield among applicants is planned.
