# UWM Academic ForgivenessRenewal

# Eligibility

To qualify for <u>academic forgivenessrenewal</u>, a former degree candidate must:

- <u>1.</u> Not have graduated from UW-Milwaukee or have earned a baccalaureate degree or associate degree from any other institution.
- 1.2.Not have been enrolled at UW-Milwaukee for two consecutive years.
- 2. Not have been enrolled as a degree- or non-degree-seeking student at UW-Milwaukee or any other academic institution for a period of three consecutive years any time between initial enrollment at UWM and readmission. Enrollment in any credit course through any academic institution disrupts the required three-year non-enrollment period, even if the student withdrew from the course(s).
- 3. Be readmitted to UW-Milwaukee as a degree-seeking student, and
- 4. Have a cumulative grade-point average (GPA) below a 2.00 at the time of readmission.

### **Explanations and Restrictions**

- 1. The "Academic Forgiveness-Renewal PeriodPeriod"-comprises is defined as all academic work completed at UW-Milwaukee prior to the three-two-year period of no enrollment.
- 2. After readmission, students must earn a GPA of 2.5 or higher in the first 12 earned credits at UW-Milwaukee BEFORE applying for academic <u>forgivenessrenewal</u>.
- 3. Academic forgivenessrenewal does not adjust the GPA and number of credits attempted and counted toward Satisfactory Academic Progress for financial aid.
- 4. All other University policies (for example, <u>the</u>UW-Milwaukee Repeat Policy) remain in effect and are not changed by the <u>academic forgiveness policygranting</u> <u>of academic renewal</u>.

- 5. To be eligible for a bachelor's degree, students must complete a minimum of 30 credits at UW-Milwaukee after the granting of academic forgivenessrenewal. To be eligible for an associate degree, students must complete a minimum of 12 credits at UW-Milwaukee after the granting of academic forgivenessrenewal.
- 6. If a student seeks admission to a degree program <u>in a school or college</u> other than the one that granted his/her academic <u>forgivenessrenewal</u>, that school or college has the right to consider all coursework and grades, including those academically forgiven, in making its admission determination.

# Impact on Student's Record

- A notation in the remarks area of the student's transcript indicates academic forgivenessrenewal. All courses taken and grades earned during the Academic ForgivenessRenewal Period will continue to appear on the student's record, but the grades of all classes taken during the Academic ForgivenessRenewal Period will be excluded from the student's cumulative grade point averageGPA.
- 1.2.All grades earned in courses that were taken during the Academic Forgiveness<u>Renewal</u> Period will be excluded from the student's cumulative grade point average<u>GPA</u>. Students may not retain grades earned in some courses within the Academic Forgiveness<u>Renewal</u> Period and have academic forgiveness<u>renewal</u> applied to others.
- 2.3.If academic forgivenessrenewal is granted, credit hours earned during the Academic ForgivenessRenewal Period may be used to satisfy degree requirements even though they are not included in calculating the student's total GPA.

### **Repeat Requests**

Students may be granted only one <u>Aa</u>cademic <u>Forgiveness<u>Rrenewal</u></u>.
