VI. New Business:

A. Microcredentials

The committee requested a needs assessment at its November meeting. 1400 students responded to the survey. Both undergrad and grad students were very much in favor of micro-credential programs. Business, health, and IT were the most preferred categories. Categories unique to the grad school included data analytics, leadership, and DEI. Students expressed the need to ensure that micro-credentials will be recognized by employers and connect to skills employers are seeking.

The committee thanked Laura Pedrick and Phyllis King for all the work they did on the needs assessment.

Shevaun Watson moved to approve the Micro-Credential Policy. Aki Roberts seconded and the motion carried. Ivan Ascher abstained.

B. [Undergraduate Program Review - English](#)

The English Department is one of the largest departments on campus and serves all UWM students. The number of faculty has declined; the number of majors has also declined but is still a large and healthy number. The review committee recommends that the program be continued. Further recommendations include continuing to recruit and retain students, especially underrepresented students; helping students declare sooner so that they are able to fully utilize resources; and exploring opportunities to cross-list courses.

Kristen Murphy expressed concern that certain student data was missing from the report. She will work with the review team to amend the report, noting that the changes will affect the format rather than the content of the report.

Bill Malcuit moved to approve contingent on modifications. Nicolas Russell seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

C. [Korean Studies Minor](#)

Korean has been taught for a long time at UWM and has been growing steadily. With significant growth and visibility of South Korea, there is growing interest among students. Students have been asking for this program. No new courses needed but they hope to add more courses to offer students more selection.

Jen Gutzman moved to approve the minor. Shevaun Watson seconded and the motion carried.
