4. Approval of Research Integrity Training Policy

Kris O'Connor summarized the policy by stating that UWM personnel involved in research are expected to practice research integrity, abiding by established state and federal laws, professional norms, and ethical principles in the performance of their scholarly activities.

UWM requires faculty and staff who are eligible to serve as Principal Investigators to complete relevant institutionally required research integrity training. The required training modules are determined by the Provost.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the policy. The motion was unanimously approved.

5. Updates from the Office of Research

Anne Kissack shared information about the UWM branded PIVOT-RP website. UWM has subscribed to the PIVOT platform for years, but it has been underutilized. It offers the broadest global coverage of available funding opportunities in a single, editorially curated database. It also offers the ability to search thousands of conferences that are requesting "call for papers" to present.

The Office of Research Development Services offers group presentations, one-on-one trainings, and drop-in office hours via TEAMS for new and on-going PIVOT users.

6. Review of Research Infrastructure Planning Activities

Kris O'Connor discussed the peer review that was completed by the National Council of University Research Administrators to examine all aspects of UWM's research support operations to optimize support for UWM's status as an R1 research university.

The main recommendations were:

- Develop strategy to provide better local support for PIs across the campus.
- Develop more robust core/shared facilities.
- Create a multi-year strategic plan for advancing research at UWM that identifies institutional priorities and strategies.

Kris discussed developing strategic research areas or impact areas for UWM. A sample of key research areas from other universities were presented as examples. It was proposed that a task force of faculty, staff, and administrators could work on this in the future.
