- IV. Approval of the meeting minutes from February 13, 2024.
 Jen Gutzman moved to approve the minutes from the last meeting. Ionel Popa seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.
- V. Unfinished Business: None

VI. New Business:

- A. Supply Chain Operations Management, BBA/Digital Supply Chain Management, MS
 - 1. Proposal
 - 2. <u>Five-Year Plan</u>

The accelerated graduate degree allows students to earn a BBA and an MS in five years. The advising team will ensure that students meet requirements in time.

Gwyn Wallander moved to approve the accelerated degree proposal. Jen Gutzman seconded the motion and it carried.

B. <u>Undergraduate Program Review - Animation</u>

This was the initial five-year review of the Animation program. The review team recommended that the program be continued. Additional recommendations included: improved pay for lecturers, funding aligned with program growth, tracking career outcomes after graduation, future hire with knowledge of the business side of animation.

Two errors were noted in the report: (1) Change next review date to 2033 instead of 2028. (2) No standards are listed for item number 6. Remove language stating standards were met.

Mike Newman moved to approve the report as corrected. Nicolas Russell seconded the motion and the corrected report was approved.

C. Revisions to UWM's General Education Requirements

- 2. Faculty Document 2836R2 Clean
- 3. Faculty Document 2836R2 Summary of Changes

Dave Clark presented the proposed changes to GER. He also shared another document, detailing additional changes, including:

- 1. Courses may only appear in one distribution area.
- 2. Exceptions to the ban on prerequisites.
 - a. Courses that require completion of OWC-A or QL-A
 - b. Courses that require another GER course in the same distribution area
 - c. Courses that require admission to Honors for courses in the Honors College
- 3. Better definition of laboratory or fieldwork requirement.

The new policy allows for six distributional areas (buckets) – original four with new, more descriptive names, plus two, and requires 18 credits instead of 21. Cultural Diversity remains separate, and students can double dip. Lab/fieldwork is also separate. The new policy also supports APCC in providing better governance of GER courses. The goal is to help students graduate in four years.

Concerns about buckets: big change to distribution areas. Are the new buckets taking anything away from the old buckets (e.g., H, NS, SS)? Using titles that mean something to students. Will new buckets cause problems for transfer students?

Concerns about credit totals: implementation is not consistent. Use the word "equivalent" to eliminate confusion. Should we say, "at least 3 credits" and allow students to take 4-credit courses?

Concerns about effective date: Use the phrase "students entering" rather than "freshman."

Kristen Murphy moved to postpone further discussion and voting until April. Ionel Popa seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.
