

Teaching English as a Foreign Language (TEFL) Certificate Program

Build upon your passion for teaching and earn a professional certificate, all while serving as a Peace Corps Volunteer. Volunteers in designated countries support student achievement by teaching English as a foreign language to both children and adults in their host communities.

Components of the TEFL Certificate Program

Pre-departure: Four e-learning modules completed over a twelve-week period

Pre-service Training: Ten to twelve weeks of technical, language, medical, and safety and security training, including a practicum of at least one week with ten hours of practice teaching

Online Learning Community: Quarterly online professional development events facillitated by Peace Corps staff at posts

Volunteer Evaluation: Two years of supervised classroom teaching experience during Peace Corps service

In-service Training: Several multi-day training events totaling 120 hours of training and practice during Peace Corps service

Certificate: The Peace Corps TEFL Certificate is validated by the Center for Applied Linguistics in Washington, D.C. and recognized both nationally and internationally
