#### **About TAC**

UWM is partnering with the Center for Adoption Support and Education (C.A.S.E.) to offer intensive, evidence-based training specifically designed to provide social work, mental health, and child welfare professionals with clinical knowledge and skills needed to serve the adoption/kinship network.

C.A.S.E. received accreditation of its Training for Adoption Competency from the Institute of Credentialing Excellence (ICE) in November 2020, making **TAC the only certificate accreditation program** for adoption competency.

## **Training Format**
