She also adds that there, they promote nominations for freshman and transfer student senators, which open on Monday the 13th and stay open for a week. - OAC: Zen begins by introducing themselves and what the OAC branch does. Zen chairs the judicial branch of the Student Association. They help make sure that all members of SA are abiding by the governing documents and relevant state, federal, and local laws. Zen also adds that in addition to that he will be sitting on the search and screen committee for a new Assistant Director for the Student Association Professional staff. They then proceed to add that on a slightly less happy note there is a Deputy Commissioner on the OAC who has been quite inactive. III. Questions and Concerns

Reed begins by saying that over the summer he was on the AAUP the UWM Chapter of American Association of University Professors in which he is a member they decided to pass a statement addressing the demand for a vaccine mandate for UWM, after quite a bit of debate on weighing the pros and cons. Reed says that he is happy to send it out, but he says that they decided to go ahead and ask the Chancellor to insist on a vaccine mandate for students, faculty, and staff with some carefully worded language discussing that we have to acknowledge certain individuals who may not have access to health care in the way that one would hope, and the mandate may impact their lives in a way that is disproportionate to others. Reed is interested in putting together a similar document with the Senate with the same concerns mentioned so if anyone is interested to let him know. He then adds to the situation with OAC and the inactive Deputy Commissioner because it is their job as legislators.

Mia pauses to ask any questions, and then she continues.

Zen also offers their help for legislation writing as they have been a part of SA for some time. They will not tell you what you should and should not put in legislation, but they can help with wording and proof reading and the importance of governance and bylaws.

Daniel also offers any help to academic senators, in line with what Zen was saying. and then also directs the other senators who to go to for any assistance.

Mia opens the floor to discuss a Senate meeting for next week Sunday. Zen adds that they may not be able to come so there would not be an OAC presence, so Kristin could get sworn in at the next Senate meeting. Reed proposes to do a virtual option, a Teams meeting could be possible. Daniel agrees that it could be better because it would count as an emergency meeting because it would be nice not to have to wait two weeks.

Mias course of action is to send out an invite next Sunday for a virtual meeting. If that doesn't work, she can explore other times or options.

Sarah talks about the committees that need to be filled in and that is something you can apply for online through Presence. Filling these seats is crucial. She adds that you can reach out to herself, Wesley, or Daniel and to please consider nominating yourself. Every senator is required to sit on one committee, but they can sit on up to four.
