#### I. Open Forum

Will S. SGA President at UW-Stevens Point: He wants to make statewide student government a little stronger and before that was UWSSR, otherwise known as reps from 2016-2019. Will is trying to make it so we can all communicate again to talk about issues that affect the system on a statewide level. Our voices mean more if we are unified.

Zen Johnston: They are the chair of OAC, but what you may not know is that they have been in student government longer than most of us have been in college. They were the youngest ever and first nonbinary president of UW-Rock County. They were then the transfer/student commuter advocate... and so on and so forth. They wanted to take this opportunity to inform those who don't know about the history of the UWSSR.

Meria Meadows and students: They begin by explaining the event that happened with the antiabortion group, and they were comparing it to problematic things like the holocaust and slavery. They never once

saw any UWM PD or UWM Staff observe to see what was happening. This meeting space was never reserved. Being on that plaza also isn't the equivalent of public property either. They want to close these loopholes, so these things cannot happen. They are here to not fight abortion but antisemitism and other communities. As students of UWM they should not have to walk through campus and see these reminders as a Jewish student, they hope that this elected body wants to share in this meeting. Another student adds that the racial imagery used was inappropriate and disgusting, as this is trauma relived.

Teresa Davis a sophomore, also adds that they were stopped by this group to which they were met with homophobic and bigoted remarks.

Mia then thanks them for bringing it to our attention, and echoes that we are here to support them. As do other members of Exec and the Senate.

## II. Approval of Agenda
