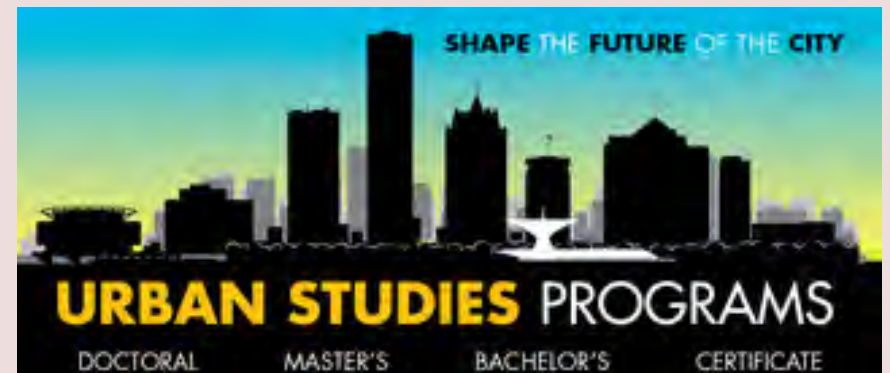


PANELIST PROFILE



JAMES MATHY

James Mathy is the Housing Administrator of the Milwaukee County Housing Division. He is responsible for the management of Milwaukee County's CDBG, HOME, Section 8, Continuum of Care, and Special Needs Homeless Programs, and is the author of Milwaukee County's Plan to End Chronic Homelessness. James has 20 years experience working in the housing and community health field with a focus on the development of homeless programs and permanent supportive housing. James possesses a Master's Degree from Marquette University in Public Service.



PANELIST PROFILE

KORI SCHNEIDER PERAGINE

Kori Schneider Peragine is the Senior Administrator of the Inclusive Communities Program at the Metropolitan Milwaukee Fair Housing Council (MMFHC), where she has been employed since 1998. She has Master's Degrees of Urban Planning and of Architecture from the University of Wisconsin - Milwaukee. Kori uses her expertise on local, state, and federal housing policies to work toward MMFHC's mission of creating and maintaining racially and economically integrated housing patterns. Currently, she is collaborating with local Public Housing Authorities and national housing mobility experts to develop tenant-based housing mobility in Southeastern Wisconsin.



RAPHAEL RAMOS

Raphael Ramos is the Project Coordinator for Legal Action of Wisconsin's Eviction Defense Project. Raphael graduated from Marquette University Law School in 2008 and prior to joining Legal Action, Raphael did legal work for GE Healthcare in

Wauwatosa and practiced environmental law at Quarles & Brady in Milwaukee. Raphael has been active in pro bono service throughout his career, volunteering with the Marquette Volunteer Legal Clinic and other pro bono service providers since graduating from Law School. At Legal Action, Raphael has overseen the successful launch of the Eviction Defense Project in January 2017. The Eviction Defense Project is the product of numerous community partnerships, and is funded through a two-year Pro Bono Innovation Grant from the Legal Services Corporation.

PANELIST PROFILE

ARIJIT SEN



Dr. Arijit Sen is an architect and vernacular architecture historian who writes, teaches and studies urban cultural landscapes. He has worked on post disaster reconstruction and community-based design in the Lower Ninth Ward, New Orleans and directed public history and cultural landscapes field schools in Milwaukee. He is an Associate Professor of Architecture and an affiliate of Urban Studies Programs at the University of Wisconsin - Milwaukee and teaches courses in American cultural landscapes that focus on methods of doing urban fieldwork and research. Dr. Sen co-founded the multi-campus based Buildings-Landscapes-Cultures area of doctoral research on cultural landscapes and has co-edited *Landscapes of Mobility: Culture, Politics and Placemaking* (Ashgate Publishers, UK, 2013, Jennifer Johung co-editor) and *Making Place: Space and Embodiment in the City* (Indiana University Press, 2014, Lisa Silverman co-editor).

REBECCA STONER

Rebecca Stoner is the Director of Development at ACTS Housing, a nonprofit social enterprise that supports families in Milwaukee's neighborhoods in becoming homeowners. She came to Milwaukee to earn her Master's Degree in Nonprofit Administration through the Trinity Fellows Program at Marquette, and stuck around after she fell in love with the City. Rebecca has spent most of her career in various housing organizations. She is passionate about affordable homeownership and just recently bought her first home with her husband on Milwaukee's north side.
