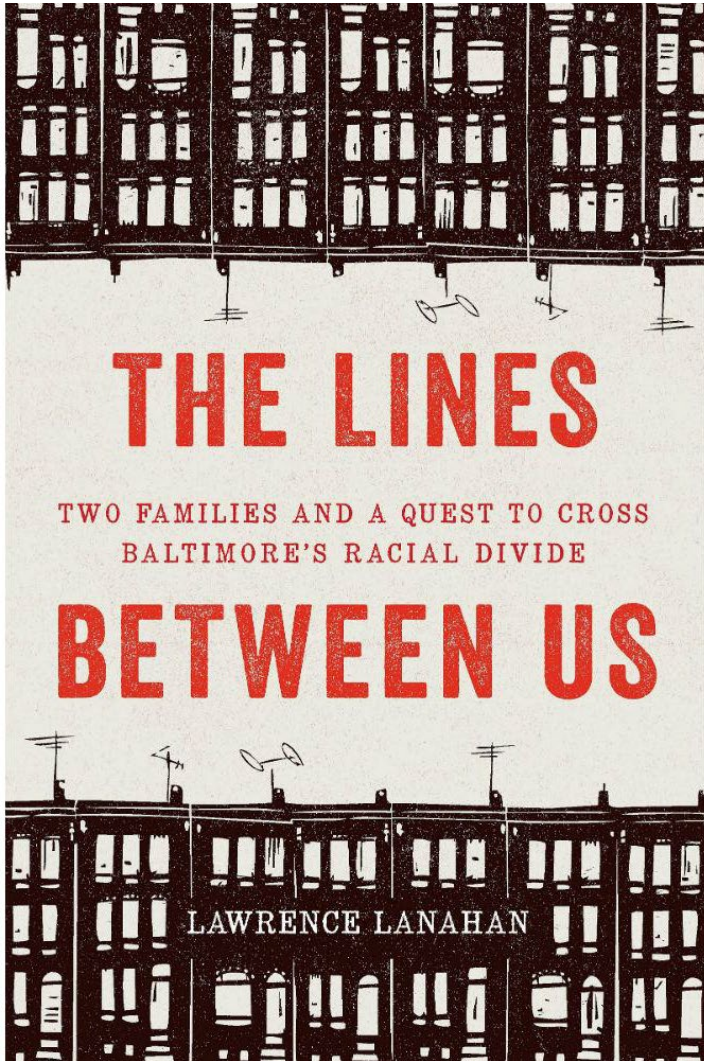

About the speaker: **Lawrence Lanahan** is an award-winning journalist and author whose work has appeared on Colorlines, NPR's Morning Edition, and Al-Jazeera America, among other outlets. His fifty-episode series for Baltimore's public radio station WYPR, also called *The Lines Between Us*, won Columbia University's duPont Award. A recipient of the Carey Institute's Logan Nonfiction Fellowship, Lanahan grew up in the Baltimore region and has lived for many years in the city of Baltimore, where he has reported on the dynamics of segregation and racial inequality for more than a decade. Lanahan has master's degrees in sociology from American University and in journalism from Columbia University.
